Again, it is time to check what your child is doing in 'secret' or openly on their phones, in the TIK – TOK and Snap Chat digital medium. I have become aware that students are using quite inappropriate, damaging and vicious language in their messages to each other, which breaks every code of conduct in all we expect of their behaviour, even outside the school gates. Parents, caregivers, please monitor and check your child's activity on their mobile phones. The health and wellbeing of students is a priority and a constant concern. We are available for you to seek guidance and direction and can only be responsible for taking action if this occurs during school times.

As you have become aware, since Mr Pedlar's recent email, the activity of vaping is very much a concern in our local and wider community. This choice of activity is illegal and is not tolerated at Kearnan and consequences will be swift and immediate if students engage at school. I do hope that a discussion has been prioritised in every home to discuss the implications of inappropriate behaviour and habits and the harm this can cause to healthy adolescent bodies.

Thank you for your positive support to our community, we value your co-operation, contribution, and participation to support your child's education.

Mr Kevin Bennett organised a fitting tribute for our Remembrance Day Service today in Wanju Place. The whole school took part in the commemoration service, remembering the sacrifices of all men and women who died in all wars, reflecting in silence, wearing a poppy to support the veteran community. November 11 has grown to be an annual day of earnest remembrance for those who served and sacrificed during all wars and armed conflicts.

Year 9 Outdoor Education Camp

The students have been prepping for the past 5 weeks and have been learning how to care for their environment with the leave no trace program. Examinations

The end of year brings on exams for students in Year 10, 11 and 12. Currently our ATAR Year 12 students are navigating through the external exams. It has been great to see some of our students continue to come into the College to see teaching staff for extra support and utilise study facilities.

Our Year 11 ATAR students are completing their final examination today and have worked well this week. Next week Year 10's commence their exam week. Whilst it is not compulsory for Year 10's to complete exams, we feel that it is a vital learning experience for students aspiring to complete ATAR subjects and prepares them well going into Year 11.

For students in Year 10 not pursuing an ATAR pathway next year, this week is their final assessments, which are delivered in a similar way to Senior School General Subjects such as the Externally Set Task (EST) that they will complete in Year 12.

Academy Day Out

Last Thursday our academy students enjoyed a day out in Busselton to celebrate the year of Academy Sport. This program targets students who wish to take their sport to the next level in a Netball and Basketball context. Students have trained during Monday's lessons all year and have made growth and improvements in all areas. Uniform Reminders

As the weather changes and the end of year approaches, there are several opportunities for students to be in PE uniform for various events. Staff are constantly reminding students about the uniform requirements. Some key points to remember.

- Students should always come to school in full formal uniform (except for Thursday). If students have sport, they must get changed at school before and after.
- School shoes must be 'leather school style'. Black runners do not adhere to the policy. If families are having trouble sourcing shoes, please write to your homeroom teacher for an exemption, stating when your child will be in correct shoes.
- PE Uniform – Shorts must be black airflows or KC shorts. Both are available at the uniform shop.
- Socks – Formal uniform for girls is White socks and for boys' Black socks. PE uniform is Black socks for boys and girls.
- No under garments should be worn under uniforms that protrudes outside of the uniform (eg a long sleeve jumper under a PE shirt).
- Hair touching the collar must be tied up for both girls and boys.

Learning to wear the correct uniform is a valuable lesson for our students. One day they will be out in the workforce where not adhering to the dress code may lead to termination of employment.


