Year 6 Graduation Mass & Awards

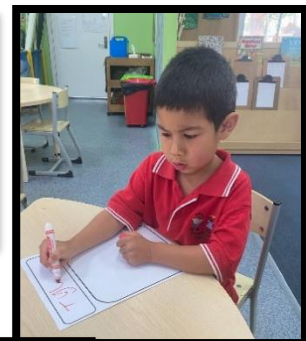
