1. Contextual Information

Established in 1925 by the Sisters of St Joseph, Kearnan College is a Catholic co-educational Kindergarten to Year 12 school 300km south of Perth that services the towns and surrounding areas of Manjimup, Bridgetown, Northcliffe, Pemberton, Boyup Brook and Nannup.

The College consists of Primary School (Kindergarten to Year 6) which encapsulates an Early Childhood Education Centre, and Middle to Upper Primary and a Secondary School which adopts programs to cater for Middle School and Senior School learners. Our ECE staff embrace a play-based philosophy in order to enhance student learning. Kearnan College provides a holistic education where relationships and learning are both important. In the Senior School, a broad curriculum exists that allows students to aspire for university entrance, work placement and further education at TAFE.

A broad range of extra-curricular activities such as sport, academic competitions, retreats, camps, and student leadership experiences highlight the pastoral and educational programs offered. The College has a professional staff that gives enormous hours of time to both curricula and extra-curricular activities.

The average attendance rate for staff was 78% and the College continues to have a very low staff turn-over with 82% of permanent teaching and non-teaching staff remaining with in 2022. The average cost to the school for professional development was \$167.00 per teacher (due to COVID & TEAMS training).

A written note or email must also be supplied to the College explaining the absence on the day the student returns. If a parent does not contact the school when their child is absent, College personnel SMS and then phone the parent to determine the whereabouts of the child. If a student has a high number of absences, then a parent is required to attend an interview with the Head of Primary, Head of Secondary or the Principal.

31% completed Certificate III



7. NAPLAN Information

College staff work very hard to support the community. Whilst Kearnan College is a small regional school, students are offered a full range of participatory opportunities, as the College ball, retreat programs, camps, sporting events, country week and representing the College in a variety of academic events. Students and parents appreciate involvement in all these opportunities.

Stakeholders are very satisfied with the school community as evidenced by the following:

- Effective School Improvement NSI feedback data was affirming and positive from parents, students, and staff in areas of Catholic Identity, School Climate and Protective and Risk Factors.
- Introduction and transition of the new school uniform was widely received, supported, and continues to be worn proudly by students.
- Advisory Council presented a CDP to CECWA for future development of the Early Learning classroom environment and school facilities to enhance better outcomes and learning opportunities.
- P&F committee continues to be well supported by parents. Parent representative volunteers were allocated to primary classes to encourage engagement for fund raising and functional activities to build sense of community.
- Successful P&F fundraising with Bridgetown Craft Fair and Manjimup Truffle Kerfuffle raised impressive monies for school resources.
- There is increased confidence in Kearnan College as enrolments continue to be sought in Primary and Secondary year levels. Year 7, Year 8 and Year 10 are bubble classes.
- Kearnan College has a strong working relationship with St Joseph's Parish and the community.
- Many students and parents request the Sacrament of Penance, Eucharist and Confirmation each year.
- Senior students' timetable is driven by student demand year by year catering for specialized fields and interests.

All parents, students and teachers are continually encouraged to raise issues or concerns with the appropriate personnel within the school. The college will always reflect and work towards a win- win resolution for all parties.

8. Post School Destinations

The College had 13 students Year 12 students in 2022. There were 7 students who undertook ATAR subjects, 5 of whom did 4 or more ATAR subjects making them eligible for university application, all of whom applied to TISC for university admission.
