Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Gifts and talents for all participants were identified and shared during a day of fun with clear direction and purpose under the leadership of Mrs Burvill, Mrs Barton, Mr Pedlar and Ms Ardagh.

Students were introduced to our School Motto - Seek Truth during the prayer session. All were asked to reflect on how they can use the motto to show they can allow their gifts to be shared, being open to give and receive from others, have courage to be outstanding, allow others to excel and do their best in all things. All students were encouraged to allow themselves to make their impact on others through their actions, acts of kindness, collaboration, reconciliation, words of consideration and acceptance in their care and service to others. We look forward to building the qualities of this group to become amazing role models for peers and Middle school students.

Congratulations to all students who will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, to be conferred by Bishop Holohan during the Saturday evening Mass this weekend. Please remember the candidates, their sponsors, and their families in your prayers. Special thanks to Bishop Holohan and Fr Edwin who spent time with the Staff and students on Wednesday.

The P&F committee are particularly keen to run a quiz night this term, so I would encourage you to think about participating in a fun filled evening with fellow parents to build upon and enrich our current relationships with each other. The evening will be held in the Parish Centre. Friday 16 September has been ear marked for this fun night of entertainment. Please keep a look out for the flyers. Get your brains trust together to make tables of 8.

You will be pleased to know CEWA have endorsed our application for Stage 7, in our 2021 CDP application. We are excited at the prospect of building a brand-new Kindy and Pre-Primary learning environment which meets the National Quality Standards in an Early Childhood Education setting. Storerooms, toilet, and wet areas as well as the outdoor play environment are all key features of the new build.

However, we must curb our enthusiasm a little, as we have one more hurdle to jump before this endorsement is fully ratified and approved by the Minister for Education. CEWA will now write an application to the Minister for Education to seek funding approval to enable our build to proceed in 2023.

This decision will be made in December 2022. We can be very grateful for this recent news as Kearnan College is only, one of 10 other schools out of 14 who were successful in their CDP application to CECWA. We are extremely fortunate.

The uniform committee did meet to discuss the style, colour, and fabric to replace the depleted sports uniform stocks of our current one. I am advising parents and caregivers that we will transition to one sport uniform for Year 1 students through to Year 12 as the future preferred uniform for all students.

The new uniform is now available on a story board and available for your feedback, with a choice of four options. This has been sent in an email through SEQTA. We value your feedback. If you have a particular view regarding colour choice, style and design, please send back your choice on the link on the Forms document. Staff, students, parents, and caregivers are invited to comment so that a final decision can be made before proceeding to the next step in the production of the new uniform.

The new black jacket we are promoting for extra warmth during winter will arrive approximately in 4 weeks' time. If you are still interested in ordering one of these, it will be important to come in and size up your child with our current sizing samples in the boardroom and not rely on what you think is the correct size.

RATs kits have arrived and will be distributed to all students during the course of next week. Each student will receive a total of 20 tests each. Teachers will inform Junior school parents and caregivers of an appropriate and available time to collect these during the week. All Secondary students will receive their kits during the week at the end of the day.

All parents and caregivers of Year 6 students are invited to make appointments with the principal to discuss continued enrolment and transition to Year 7 for 2023. This is a wonderful opportunity to speak with your child to discuss aspirations, hopes and dreams in a Secondary setting. I look forward to seeing you all in the principals office with your child at interview.
